



Poster Presentation Rules and Guidelines

- Suggested size for Posters is 36" high x 48" wide or 91.4 cm high x 121.9 cm wide Landscape orientation but 36" X 60" and 36" X 72" will also fit on the poster board (48" X 96").
- You must register and wear an official WOFAPS 2019 scientific meeting badge to gain admittance at any time to the poster areas.
- Floor plans and poster attendants will be available in QNCC to help you find your poster board.
- All poster boards will be pre-numbered with your abstract identification number which will be sent to you on acceptance of submission. Boards will be also be labelled with letter F for presentation Friday, S for presentation Saturday and SU for presentation Sunday. Please be certain to mount your poster on the correct board.
- Remember to bring your own pushpins (in your checked luggage). A very limited number of pushpins will be available at the meeting.
- Do not leave personal materials or belongings under poster boards or in the poster area. WOFAPS is not responsible for any articles left in the poster area or elsewhere.
- **You can mount your poster in the Exhibit & Poster Hall** Thursday October 31 after 1600 and Friday November 1 at 0700. Please remove your poster after the final day of congress: 1800 Sunday November 3/2019
- **Authors** must be present at their boards for the duration of their scheduled presentation time. You will have 4 minutes to present your poster with 1 minute to entertain questions. Posters should remain on the boards for all three days.
- We do not accept requests to change presentation dates or times, and it is no longer possible to withdraw your abstract. **If you are unable to present on the day assigned,** please ask a co-author or colleague to present on your behalf.

. Video Poster Guidelines

- Video files should be submitted in .wmv, .swf, .flv, mpg., .mpeg, .m4v, .mov, or .mp4 formats only (file size limit is 100mb). Videos should be formatted with a 320 x 240 pixel minimum screen size and should not exceed 10 minutes runtime.
